Education for Children:  
Nehru wanted free education to be given to all children. He said it is the duty of the states to provide free education to every child in the country. Children’s education should suit them. Apart from the traditional education, he wanted the children to learn the application of science so that they can understand and fit into the modern world and develop a scientific temper. A sound mind in a sound body was Nehru’s principle, children should be healthy and strong. He ordered free milk and food to be given to children.

Women’s Education:  
Nehru stressed the importance of women’s education. He felt that educating a women is educating a whole family. It will have a great influence on men. It was hence necessary for women to be educated, if not for themselves, at any rate for their children.

Higher Education:

They include All India Institute of Medical Science, Indian Institutes of Technology, Indian Institutes of Management and many other places of higher learning.

Nehru created mass village enrolment programmes and arranged for the construction of thousands of schools and colleges all over the country. More over, adult education centres and vocational education centres were also established in several places.
